

Adjective

A word that describes somebody or something. Either come before a noun, or after a verb

For example: old, white, careful, horrible, nice, busy

Adverb

Adverbs give extra meaning to a verb, adjective, another adverb or a whole sentence

For example:

I really enjoyed the party



Connective

A word or phrase that links clauses or sentences.

For example: also, however, in other words, meanwhile, later, but , although



Noun

A word that represents
somebody or something

For example: sister, money, car,
butter, cotton

Parenthesis

A word or phrase added to a sentence to explain or elaborate.

For example: Sarah is, I believe, our best student

Prefix

A morpheme which is added to the beginning of words to change its meaning

For example: in, dis, super, uni



Pronoun

Used to replace a noun or noun phrase

For example: him, her, he, she,
yours, mine, who, someone,
something



Suffix

A morpheme that is added to the end of a word to change its meaning

For example: ed, ing, est, ly



Verb

A word that expresses an action

For example: wait, drive, make,
laugh, cry, run, think



Prepositions

A word used to indicate time, position or direction.

For example: above, below, during, since, beside, between
